CLINICIAN LEVELS

LEVEL I

Undergraduate Students-Spring Term

- Function as co-clinicians with one client
- Equal responsibility for treatment plans, materials, and EOT report
- Develop clinical knowledge & skills according to the PoLO-C design system
 - Design personal Learning Outcomes using the PoLO-C *Blueprint*
- Weekly clock hours (credit)
- Attend Clinical Staff Meetings
- Complete all EOT documentation; monitor clinical clock hours acquired and needed

LEVEL II

First Year Graduate Students-Fall and Spring terms

- Work independently or as mentor to Level I Clinicians in NMSU Speech and Hearing Center
 - Intervention (Fall/Spring)
 - Evaluation (Spring)
 - Audiology Clinic (Fall/Spring)
- Develop clinical knowledge & skills according to the PoLO-C design system
 - Design personal Learning Outcomes using the PoLO-C *Blueprint*
 - Design client/other Service Outcomes using the PoLO-S *Blueprint*
- Attend Clinical Staff Meetings
- Complete all EOT documentation; monitor clinical clock hours acquired and needed

LEVEL III

First Year Graduate Students Summer I and Summer II terms

- NMSU Speech and Hearing Center
 - Intervention
 - Evaluation
- Develop clinical knowledge & skills according to the PoLO-C design system
 - Design personal Learning Outcomes using the PoLO-C *Blueprint*
 - Design client/other Service Outcomes using the PoLO-S *Blueprint*
- Attend Clinical Staff Meetings
- Complete a minimum of **65 clock hours** (supervised following ASHA direct observation requirements) by the end of Summer II
- Complete all EOT documentation; monitor clinical clock hours acquired and needed
